

A faulty garage door can impact home [EM Garage Door Opener Repair in Los Angeles](#) security, car access, and daily routines. Whether the garage door will not open, makes unusual noises, or has visible damage, the appropriate solution depends on the damaged component, the door's age, and the overall state of the entire system. Which garage door issues need immediate repair?

Garage door safety sensors are essential as well. These small devices near the floor should point toward each other and stop the door from closing when an object interrupts the beam. If the sensors are misaligned, damaged, or bypassed, the door may close on a person, pet, or vehicle. 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How much does garage door repair in Los Angeles?

How much does it cost to replace a one-car or two-car garage door?

Garage door size is a key cost factor. A single-car door is often approximately 8 or 9 feet wide, while a **two-car garage door** is commonly 16 feet wide, though openings vary. A larger door requires heavier panels, stronger springs, longer tracks, and an opener rated for the load.

The **2 car garage door replacement cost**, also referred to as the **two car garage door replacement cost**, commonly ranges from about \$1,200 to \$4,500 or more for residential replacement and installation.
