- Books
- Decorations
- Fragile items
- Specialty belongings

Take note of large or heavy items. This information can help your moving company determine the appropriate equipment and crew size.

Measure Your New Apartment

Reserve the Elevator in Advance

Tell your movers:

- Any access codes or keys required

If the building has a freight elevator, confirm whether it can accommodate your largest furniture items.

Do not pack everything into the moving truck. Keep a separate essentials bag or box containing items you may need immediately after arriving at your new apartment.

Consider including:

- Phone chargers
- Medications
- Toiletries
- Change of clothes
- Important documents
- Basic cleaning supplies
- Snacks and water
- Basic kitchen items
- Pet supplies

Keep these items with you instead of placing them in the moving truck.

Prepare for Moving Day

The day before your move, complete as much preparation as possible. Most of your belongings should already be packed and labeled.

Before movers arrive:

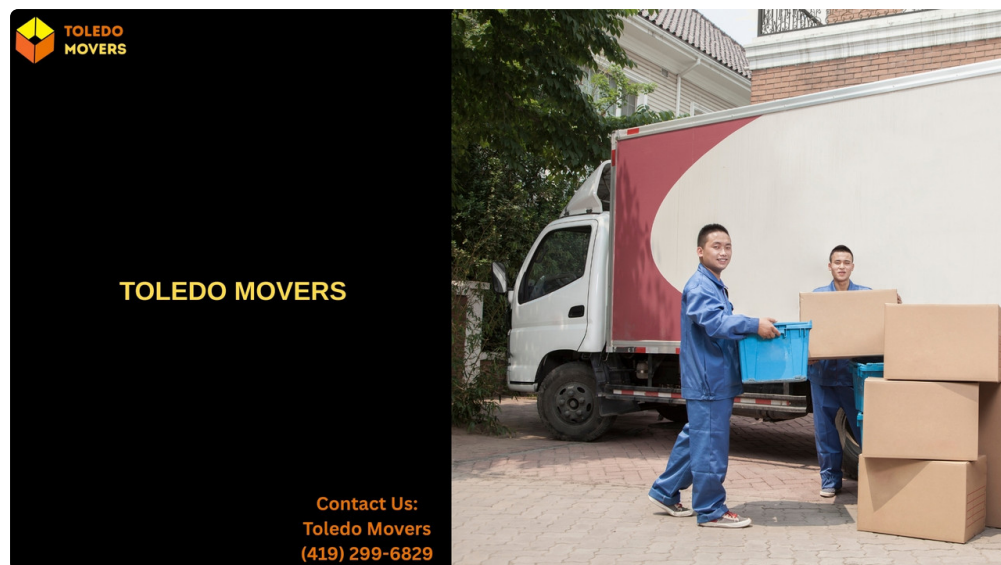
- Using appropriate moving equipment
