

A cracked windshield has a way of turning an ordinary Greensboro drive into a small expedition. One minute you are rolling down West Market Street, easing past school traffic or heading toward I-40, and the next minute a stone snaps off a truck tire and leaves a bright little star in the glass. At first, it looks harmless. Then the afternoon sun hits it. Then the temperature drops overnight. By morning, that small chip has stretched a finger across your line of sight.
